Cofitexte

- The COVID-19 crisis strikes in March 2020 and leads to the closure of the borders from March 2020 to the end of June 2022
- 83 islands and over 318,000 inhabitants
- ▶ 98% of the population has telephone coverage
- High cost of internet 39.3% of the population has access to the internet and 64.7% of the population has access to electricity
- Access is a challenge
- First case of COVID-19 outside the quarantine centre in March 2022
- School closures in March 2020 and panic among the population





Representative of the Ministry of Education and 16 Form6tiofi

- State of emergency
- Home learning pack impossible to deliver to all students
- Partnership between telecommunication providers and the Ministry of Education and Training of Vanuatu
- Memorandum of understanding for primary schools, high schools, universities, institutional sites and selected learning sites
- Use of public IP addresses to identify free sites for all users - fixed and mobile internet



Ch6llefiges

- Internet providers under great pressure
- Testing the solution for all types of users
- Need to test regularly
- Bandwidth limitation: no videos
- ▶ 56.30% of the population in Vanuatu is under 25 years old
- Cost coverage by institutions
